

site to the fields at the South should only be from the existing designated public footpath from the Drift (if incorporated as suggested in the proposals).

Outlook to Harlaxton Manor (SKR- PR327)

The proposals envisage that "the development of the site should seek to positively incorporate views towards Harlaxton Manor and its setting."

It also enjoys the views to Harlaxton Manor. As noted above no access to or from the Western boundary of the site should be allowed as this could disrupt this unique view and historical heritage.

Outlook to Barrowby Village (SKR- PR327)

Views of agricultural land Barrowby to the West would be destroyed by the development.

Loss of Agricultural Land (SKR- PR327)

Loss agricultural land the West would be detrimental to its heritage..

Effect on Wildlife (SKR- PR327)

My property is a haven for deer, pheasant, partridge, geese and other migratory birds, songbirds, owls, foxes, rabbits, hares and bats. Many of these come from surrounding fields and the proposed development would adversely affect them.

Archeological Significance (SKR- PR327)

There have been several archaeological finds in the immediate vicinity of my property (listed below and shown on the map below), with many dating back as far as the Bronze Age. There is a history of Roman farming across Lincolnshire and of old Roman settlements in Barrowby. The Roman findings, in particular the quern, provide evidence that a farm or allotment may have existed in this location for many centuries.
